

D. A. Rogers, Emeritus Professor
Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering

Following graduation from college and service in the U.S. Army, Rogers earned the M.S.E.E. degree at Illinois Institute of Technology and the Master of Divinity degree (Christian ministry) from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School. He earned the Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering at the University of Washington in 1971. Rogers taught in Brazil until 1980 in electrical engineering at the University of Campinas. Rogers then moved to North Dakota State University where in 2020 he retired and was awarded the rank of Emeritus Professor in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering. Aside from his work in the ECE Department, Rogers taught the College of Engineering's technology and society, history of technology, and engineering ethics courses.
