

Earn your North Dakota Superintendent's Credential at NDSU

Interested in furthering your education to obtain a North Dakota Superintendent's credential? If you qualify for, or currently hold a North Dakota Principal's credential, you can do it in two semesters at North Dakota State University!

In the upcoming 2019 summer and fall semesters the NDSU's Educational Leadership Program will be offering classes that meet the coursework requirements in [North Dakota Administrative Rule 67-11-07-05](#) for obtaining the North Dakota Superintendent's Credential.

Summer semester will consist of six credits of course work and will be delivered in a hybrid environment with both face-to-face and online experiences. Fall semester will consist of a two credit, field-based practicum. ***NDSU policy requires a minimum of 10 participants enrolled in order to offer the courses.**
