 - 1. Policy 103: Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Policy on the Announcement of Position Openings
 - MOTION to Approve (Roberts/Magel)
 - Smith: had some faculty express confusion about how postdocs would fall under this policy
 - Alan Denton (Physics) introduced the policy: described motivation for making policy revisions. Idea would be that if a PI wants to bypass the formal process for a postdoctoral hire than the faculty member would have to get approval from their Chair up to the Provost. Overall intent is to make the policy and process more transparent and equitable.
 - MOTION to Postpone (Smith/Roberts)
 - Smith: Wants to delay voting on this policy until next meeting because we have not had time to solicit feedback from our constituents
 - Christensen: Encouraged people to speak up and participate
 - o Denton: Definitely open to more feedback if people have it
 - MOTION to postpone passes
 - Voting Results: 23 AYE; 14 NAY; 2 ABSTAIN
