 - Managing volume levels to facilitate discussions. Organize based on shared interests and overlapping fields – say – when registering these are my interests and this is what I am looking for.
 - Don't believe having assigned topic was the most effective way to network. There are lots of natural topics to cover in initial 5 minutes 😊.
