## **Connie Norheim – MS 1981 Counseling and Guidance**

Connie Norheim, 72, Fargo, North Dakota, died Thursday, October 10, 2024, in One Oak Place. Connie was born October 12, 1951, in Jamestown, North Dakota to Jerry and Blanche (Piercy) Norheim.
