Brad's love of travel took him to many places around the world. Brad shared with his family a dream trip to Oslo and Bergen, Norway, in June 2024, reconnecting with the Onarheim family. A highlight of the trip was enjoying a multi-generational dinner at the ancestral Onarheim farm in the village of Onarheim on the island of Tyrnes.
