

Jerome Wahl – BS 1968 Pharmacy

Funeral service for Jerome “Jerry” Wahl, 79, of Dickinson, will be 10:00 a.m. MDT, Monday, August 26, 2024, at Stevenson Funeral Home in Dickinson with Pastor Mike Pretzer officiating. Burial and Military Honors will follow at 3:00 p.m. CDT at the North Dakota Veterans Cemetery in Mandan.

Jerome John Wahl was born on September 25, 1944, in Aberdeen, South Dakota to Oliver and Sarah (Wagemann) Wahl. He grew up in Ashley, North Dakota until he moved with his family to Bismarck. He graduated from Bismarck High School and attended Bismarck State College before finishing his education at North Dakota State University in 1968.
