

COLLEGE TEACHING CERTIFICATE

The College Teaching Certificate (CTC) is a three-semester (9-credit) graduate certificate in pedagogy for NDSU graduate students from across campus who plan to teach in a college or university and individuals who already have a graduate degree and work at NDSU. Students study contemporary education research and gain experience in the teaching and learning process through microteaching modules, field experience, peer observations, and a structured practicum.

Students enrolled in the CTC program must be concurrently enrolled in a graduate program leading to a degree or already have a graduate degree and work on campus.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS & PROCESS

- Hold a baccalaureate degree from an educational institution of recognized standing.
- Earned a cumulative grade point average (GPA) in all baccalaureate courses of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Be a current degree-seeking student enrolled in a graduate program or have a graduate degree and work at NDSU.
- Submit the College Teaching Certificate application.
- Applications should be submitted directly to the NDSU Graduate School.

QUALTRICS SURVEY SOFTWARE

NDSU holds a subscription to the Qualtrics survey software which provides all faculty, staff, and students with a FREE account. Qualtrics features a library of surveys, graphics, and questions that can be used as templates for designing your surveys. The point-and-click interface offers enhanced design capabilities and customized polling options.

SURVEY DISTRIBUTION

Surveys can be directly e-mailed to recipients, complete with tracking, reminders, and follow-up messaging. Surveys can also be sent out seeking anonymous responses.

SURVEY ANALYSIS

Survey analysis includes a variety of statistical survey tools and graphics. Data can be exported into Excel, SPSS, PDF, PowerPoint, or Word formats for further analysis.

VIRTUAL MEETINGS

MeetingSphere is a FREE virtual meeting software for NDSU-related projects by faculty, staff, and students. When using MeetingSphere for your meetings, participants can type comments at the same time and remain anonymous, which allows for more meeting participation. Comments, voting sessions, and opinion polls are instantly recorded and available for further analysis after your meeting. The GDC's expert facilitation of meetings using this software allows for more effective meetings. All meetings include a dedicated meeting space equipped with computers for participants.

INSTRUCTIONAL COACHING

The Office of Teaching and Learning supports you and your department in increasing student learning and retention. This program is designed to provide you with teaching strategies, tips, and encouragement to continue to grow in your role as an instructor, no matter where you are at in your career.

The program can also help develop and implement a professional development plan exclusive to your department's needs.

We provide assistance even if you already have a well-designed class, want to learn more engaging teaching methods, or want to strengthen your assessments. Our coaches assist you and your program in identifying goals and strategies that take your class or program to a new level.

WORK WITH AN INSTRUCTIONAL COACH

Our instructional coaches work with departments and individual instructors offering one-on-one consultations. Each coaching session provides personalized guidance to support effective teaching at NDSU.

PROCESS

- 1. Request a consultation
- 2. An instructional coach will contact you within two days to set up an initial consultation.
- 3. Your coach will listen to what you want to achieve, ask questions, and offer solutions.
- Additional meetings may be scheduled as needed.

Instructional coaching is a FREE, personalized, and confidential service.

Share what you know so K-12 teachers can use the understanding, skills, and applications in the classroom tomorrow. Establishing a connection with K-12 teachers in your field provides many benefits including:

- understanding the curriculum of different school districts.
- learning together as you grapple with ideas,
- · increasing pedagogical knowledge,
- refreshing and deepening your knowledge in your own subject matter, and
- becoming a mentor for educators in a related field.

K-12 teachers depend on professional development classes for staff development, teaching license renewal, and pay scale advancement.

SCHOOL DISTRICTS

Establish a solid, ongoing relationship with NDSU by seeking professional development graduate credit for your district's courses.

We also encourage you to open your high-quality courses to K-12 teachers statewide. By offering your courses statewide you allow all teachers in North Dakota to learn together.

APPROVAL PROCESS

Individuals interested in offering K-12 professional development courses must complete the course proposal and course syllabus forms. After your course has been through the approval process, you will receive a teaching contract via email. Compensation varies.



PEER TEACHING

We know that observing each other in the classroom and discussing it with others, is a great way to become a better teacher. In this program, NDSU faculty and teaching staff get involved in those observations and discussions.

There are two available tracks.

TRACK 1: FORMAL PEER TEACHING REVIEW

You will be matched with a senior faculty member trained in formal pedagogy review. Upon completion, you will receive a formal report for promotion, tenure and evaluation (PTE) portfolios, and for career promotion purposes.

TRACK 2: INFORMAL PEER TEACHING PARTNERSHIP

This track is an open and personalized teaching partnership between you and your peers that aims to improve individual teaching effectiveness through productive and discreet feedback.

This option can be used as an informal professional development opportunity, or you may choose to write teaching support letters for your portfolios.


