### KITCHEN, BATHROOM & LIVING ROOM

Every room in the home is a learning place. Some activities designed to help children develop the values, attitudes, and behaviors that determine achievement in school are listed below.

• KITCHEN — The kitchen can be a miracle place for learning.

\* **Hidden Letters:** From the cupboard to the refrigerator, from the stove



to the sink there are letters: A's, B's, F's, etc. On the cereal box, on the

soup cans, on the cat food, even on the soap— there are letters. Make a game of finding these letters; ask your kids to find five B's, 3 G's or any number of letters. Start easy and build to harder and harder letter combination to find.

\* Cooking up Directions: In order to cook a "dish" you have to

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first, second and so on. Select a simple recipe with your child, perhaps Jell-O or canned soup. Follow the directions step by step—reading them aloud as you go along.

BATHROOM— As they take their bath and brush their teeth spend time with your children read-

cleansers bottles. These can be a matter of life and death.

\* Float vs. Sink: Try different soaps, a dry sock, a bottle plastic full shampoo, a wet sponge, a dry sponge, an empty bottle. When plopped into the water which will float, which will sink? The important part of this game is to have children think (guess) beforehand which objects will float or sink and then test out the hypothesis—true scientific method.

\* Matching and piling:

Laundry contains mathematics.

Match the socks, count them.

Count the sheets and fold them into fractional


pares, down to half down to one-quarter.

\* Catalog Shopping Spree: Let's say you have \$25 (hypothetical) to spend. Look through a new or old mail order catalog and select your purchases: add them up; what have you left? Have you over spent? How do other members of the family decide to spend their money? Compare and contrast purchases.
