CHOOSE YOUR PHARMACY PATH EARLY

The Early Admission Pathway (EAP) provides academically qualified high school seniors with an affordable, expedited path to achieve a Doctor of Pharmacy degree in six years.

HOW EAP EXPEDITES YOUR PATH

Students complete required pre-pharmacy courses in two years. The Traditional Admissions Pathway can take up to three years to complete. Acceptance into EAP means you are conditionally accepted into the Doctor of Pharmacy program. If you successfully complete all requirements, we assure you a seat in the final four years of the professional program.

WHAT'S REQUIRED

Early Admission Pathway uses standardized exam scores such as ACT or SAT as primary selection criterion. Your high school GPA is used as a secondary criterion for acceptance in EAP. Take your ACT or SAT tests as a sophomore, junior or senior. Other standardized test scores may be used. Contact Jamie.L.Berg@ndsu.edu to discuss acceptable test substitutions if needed.
