Upcoming Enrollment for Fall 2023

Registration for Fall 2023 will begin after we return from spring break. Below you will find some highlights about our course offerings that should help you prepare for your registration. Following those highlights, is a full list of our offerings in Fall 2023.

General Information

When can/should I register for Fall 2023?: Your start date for registration is determined by the number of credits you have earned. Generally, seniors are the earliest who can register, although there are some exceptions to this (e.g. athlete status). Highlighted Courses

Archaeology of North America (ANTH 445):

This course introduces students to the archaeology of Indigenous North America from initial human occupation to the onset of the global era. The course provides students with a firm foundation in major themes in the development and diversity of Indigenous cultures in North America, as well as an introduction to key sites and archaeological remains that document these societies. Topical coverage includes earliest inhabitants, hunter-fisher-gatherer lifeways, the origins of agriculture, mound-building and ritual landscapes, long-distance trade, death and burial, the development of village-based societies, social complexity, and colonial encounters.

Introduction to Native American & Indigenous Studies (TIPS 101):

This course provides a comprehensive overview of the study of Indigenous peoples of the western hemisphere, including Native societies prior to the arrival of Europeans; contact and colonialism; Indigenous knowledge systems, nationalism, and sovereignty; and contemporary Native issues. TIPS 101 is an approved course for general education in the Humanities and Fine Arts and Cultural Diversity categories.

Feminist Theory & Discourse (SOC 424): In this course, students explore a variety of aspects of feminist thought. In this class, students learn about what constitutes this body of knowledge, challenging many preconceptions held about both feminism and gender issues. Through select readings, seminar-style class discussions, and written and oral assignments, this course will expand on your current knowledge of feminism, social theory, and gender.

Senior Capstone (ANTH/SOC 489): If you are in your junior or senior year, you should plan to take Capstone. It is ONLY offered in the fall, so you if you are planning to graduate in Fall 2023 or Spring 2024 and haven't taken Capstone, you **must** take it this fall if you want to graduate. Similar to last year, Anthropology and Sociology majors will be in class together and I (Dr. Weber) will lead you through the class with guest lectures from each of our faculty throughout the semester.
